

## Personal Timeline Activity

50pts

In this activity you will construct a chronological timeline of **12 significant events** that have happened in your lifetime. Events that are deemed historically significant often have one or more of the following characteristics:

- Significant impact on those involved (at the time they were happening and/or in the future)
- Events that changed perspectives/attitudes
- Events that changed relationships
- Events that are well remembered
- Events that affect(ed) feelings/emotions in a lasting way

### DO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1) Your timeline will begin with your birth. Add **ELEVEN** more events to the timeline.
- 2) You can use copy paper or poster board to do this project. You can tape/paste/staple copy paper together if you use it!
- 3) You must include a mixture of *personal events* and *public events* (things that have been invented, discovered, or happened)
- 4) For **three** of the *personal events* you listed, *explain why* this event was significant in your *personal history*.
  - use 3 to 5 sentences per explanation
  - each explanation should (a) *describe* the event; (b) *describe* how the event influenced who you've become; (c) what made it memorable?
- 5) For **three** of the *public events* you listed, *explain why* this event was significant in *general history*.
- 6) At least **five** of the events listed need to have a picture provided.
  - pictures from the **computer** (personal pics, internet pics, clip art); pictures **hand drawn** by you; and/or pictures cut out of **magazines**
- 7) Points will be taken off if the timeline is not neat and if it is clearly apparent no time was put into it!
- 8) You can ask your family members about some of your personal & public events to get details right.
